# **Miscanthus floridulus** BOLO (sword grass)

Your kokua is needed to prevent its spread and protect people and our native species.

#### Facts:

- Accumulates dry leaves, creating a fire hazard
- **Regenerates quickly after fire** •
- Establishes on deforested lands
- Forms dense thickets that outcompete other plants •
- Seeds are viable for 6 months making it difficult to eradicate

Be On the

Look Out!

- Seeds dispersed by wind
- Produces chemicals that slow the growth of other plants
- Designated as a Hawai'i noxious weed









#### Distribution:

- · First found on O'ahu in 1995 in Waipi'o at the Koa Ridge Mauka project
- · Recently found on O'ahu in 2011 at the Kahuku Training Area, near Pahipahialua Gulch


### Identification:

- Broad-leaved bunchgrass that is 4-13 feet tall
- Has thinner stems than sugarcane
- Flowering culms are 10-20 inches long
- · Consist of many loose spreading, feathery branches that are whitish or brownish in color
- · Leaves range in color from green to yellow and have sharp edges

## How You Can Help:

- Stay on marked trails
- Wash gear and boots before and after visiting at risk areas, this will help prevent the spread of seeds
- Report any sightings to the 643-Pest app so Miscanthus floridulus can be identified and removed
- Note where you found it and take photos if possible
- Do not attempt to pull it out, only report sightings
